Basic Rabbit Care Diet: A sound rabbit diet consists of fresh hay, good-quality pellets, and fresh vegetables Anything beyond this considered a "treat" and should be offered in limited quantities only • Hay is essential for rabbit health as the roughage provided by hay reduces the risk of gastrointestinal
